# Garkane Crews Win Safety Award

The Intermountain Power Superintendents Association (IPSA) presented Garkane with a 1st place safety award for having over 70,000 hours without a Lost Time Accident (LTA). Garkane's actual hours without an LTA was over 135,000 hours. Crews have made dedicated commitment to safety adopting NRECA's Commitment to Zero Contacts. This initiative is designed to provide cooperative CEO's, senior management, and field personnel with the ideas and resources they need to help eliminate serious injuries and fatalities due to electrical contact. ## Recommended Energy Savings Tips

### PROGRAM YOUR THERMOSTAT

Setting your thermostat one degree lower when heating or one degree higher when cooling can reduce energy use up to 5%

### LOADS OF LAUNDRY

Do full loads of laundry and wash with cold water. Using lukewarm water instead of hot can cut a load's energy use in half, and using cold water will save even more.

### DOING THE DISHES

Air dry dishes whenever possible. This step can cut your dishwasher's energy use by up to 50%.

### LIGHTING AND ELECTRONICS

Substitute LED's for conventional light bulbs. Lighting can amount to up to 12% of monthly energy use. LED bulbs can cut lighting costs by 75%. Unplug appliances and electronics when not in use. Small appliances and electronics use energy even when not in use. When powered on, game consoles tv's and similar electronics are responsible for up to 12% of energy use.

## PUBLIC HEARING NOTICE

In the most recent session the Utah State Legislature passed House Bill 66 (H.B. 66). The bill titled "Wildland Fire Planning and Cost Recovery Bill" aims to reduce the likelihood of electrical utility facilities starting a wildland fire. In accordance with the terms of H.B. 66, Garkane is preparing a draft, *Garkane Energy Wildland Fire Protection Plan*.
